1 Installation and Startup Guide

This document covers the installation of cMT-SVRX Series, for the detailed specifications and operation, please refer to Datasheet, Brochure and EasyBuilder Pro User Manual. Please read all warnings, precautions, and instructions on the device carefully before use.

Install Environment:

Electrical Environment	The HMI product has been tested to conform to European CE requirements. This means that the circuitry is designed to resist the effects of electrical noise. This does not guarantee noise immunity in severe cases. Proper wire routing and grounding will insure proper operation.		
Environmental Considerations	 Make sure that the units are installed correctly and that the operating limits are followed. Avoid installing units in environments where severe mechanical vibration or shocks are present. Do not operate the unit in areas subject to explosion hazards due to flammable gases, vapors or dusts. Do not install the unit where acid gas, such as SO2 exists. This device should be mounted in the vertical position and for use on the flat surface enclosure. 2 Unpacking the Unit

Unpack and check the delivery. If damage is found, notify the supplier.

NOTE: Place the unit on a stable surface during installation. Dropping it or letting it fall may cause damage.

3 Installation Instructions

Rail mounting: DIN rail 35mm

Panel mounting: Use two M4 or #8 panhead screws, mounting hole size is 4.6mm

Plan for adequate space around the unit and inside the enclosure, for ventilation and cables. Consider the heat from other devices inside the enclosure. The ambient temperature around the unit must be $0 \sim 50^{\circ}$ C. The aluminum flat-sheet at the back of the unit is a heat sink. Please be careful not to touch the heat sink since its heat can rise to 70° C in maximum when the unit is running. Planning for a 3cm space between the unit and other devices is recommended.



4 Power Connections

NOTE: Connect positive DC line to the '+' terminal and the DC ground to the '-' terminal.



5 System Settings

Connect the cMT-SVRX to the router using an RJ-45 Ethernet cable. Launch EasyBuilder Pro on the PC, follow section 6 instructions to access the download window, and find the cMT-SVRX to obtain its IP address. Enter this IP address in a web browser to access the system settings page, where the default password "111111" can be used to log in and configure the device.



6 EasyBuilder Pro Software Settings

Launch EasyBuilder Pro software, select your project file, press F7 shortcut key to open the download dialog box: Select Ethernet > HMI Name tab > Select your cMT-SVRX > Click Download to download this project file to cMT-SVRX.

Flash memory has a limited write lifespan, and frequent data writing (e.g., Event Log, Data Sampling) can accelerate degradation. Consider write frequency and lifespan management in system design to prevent data loss. Refer to "3.2.1. Prolong the Lifespan of Flash Memory" in the Product Security User Manual for quidance.

- 1. COM2 and COM3 [RS485] support MPI 187.5K, please use one at a time.
- 2. Use #4-40 UNC screws for the D-SUB connector installation.

8 DIP SW Settings

Turn ON SW1 and power the unit again, the IP setting is restored to default:

Ethernet 1: DHCP

Ethernet 2: 192.168.100.1

When restoring factory defaults, all projects and data stored in the unit will be cleared. Pressing the Reset button can reboot the unit.

9 Battery Replacement

Battery Specification: Type CR1220, Rated 3V

NOTE: Make sure that all local and national electrical standards are met when installing the unit. Contact your local authorities to determine which codes apply.



Power

Use power output that meets SELV (Safety Extra-Low Voltage) requirements. The unit can be powered by DC power only, voltage range: 24±20%, compatible with most controller DC systems. The power conditioning circuitry inside the unit is accomplished by a switching power supply. The peak starting current can be as high as 2A.

Fusing Requirements If the Power LED does not light up immediately after power up, remove power. A resettable fuse will protect against overcurrent faults in DC circuit and the resetting will take place after a period of time. Check wiring for proper connections and try to power up again.

High Voltage

A resettable fuse will prevent damage for overcurrent condition however it isn't guaranteed. DC voltage sources should provide proper isolation from main AC power and similar hazards.

Emergency Stop

A Hard-wired EMERGENCY STOP should be fitted in any system using an HMI to comply with ICS Safety Recommendations.




Do not power the unit and inductive DC loads, or input circuitry to the controller, with the same power supply. Note: The 24 VDC output from some controllers may not have enough current to power the unit.


- a. Power wire length should be minimized (Max: 500m shielded, 300m unshielded).
- Please use twisted pair cables for power wire and signal wire and conform to the impedance matching.
- Wire Routing
- If wiring is to be exposed to lightning or surges, use appropriate surge suppression devices.
- d. Keep AC, high energy, and rapidly switching DC power wiring separated from signal wires.
- e. Add a resistor and capacitor in the parallel connection between the ungrounded DC power supply and the frame ground. This provides a path for static and high frequency dissipation. Typical values to use are 1M Ohm and 4700pF.

DANGER

The system designer should be aware that devices in Controller systems could fail and thereby create an unsafe condition. Furthermore, electrical interference in an operator interface can lead to equipment start-up, which could result in property damage and/or physical injury to the operator.



If you use any programmable control systems that require an operator, be aware that this potential safety hazard exists and take appropriate precautions. To conform with ICS Safety Recommendations, checks should be placed in the controller to ensure that all writable registers that control critical parts of plant or machinery have limit checks built into the program, with an out-of-limit safe shut down procedure to ensure safety of personnel.
